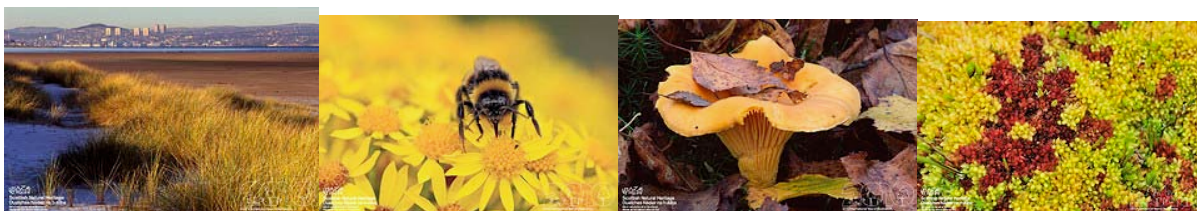
The conference is aimed at biodiversity practitioners, researchers, educationalists, Local Authority staff, and health experts.
